
About this book


• teaches people about God

People who live far away **cannot** go to important Church events or to **mass**.




Mass is an important Church event that helps people connect to God.



Many people do **not** trust the Church because Church leaders did the wrong thing in the past.

How we will make the Church better

1. Listen to new ideas to help the planet




We will

 talk to scientists to learn how to look after the planet



• give money to organisations that help the planet, such as Catholic Earthcare Australia



• talk to First Nations people and ask them to join our project with Earthcare.

First Nations means a person is Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander.



We will

 work together with other Churches to do good things

2. Spread our message



 find new ways to talk to communities that are further way



 make a new program that links Church ideas to people's lives



 have a meeting each year to plan new ways to tell people about God



• use social media to get our message across.



3. Teach interfaith

Interfaith means religions with different beliefs work together to do good things.

We will

• share information with different religions



• teach students about other faiths



 celebrate Interfaith Harmony Day on the first week of February every year.



4. Help married couples

We will

 tell the community what is good about marriage



• help married couples become Church leaders



 build networks where married couples can help each other at each stage of life



 make more services that help married couples have children and families.

5. Make women leaders



We will

 focus on new ways we can help women in the Church



 help more women in the community to become Church leaders



• include women in more Church meetings.



6. Include First Nations people

We will

teach Church leaders about
 First Nations people



• tell the community how important First Nations people are to the Church



 put a First Nations plaque on every Church and Catholic school.

The plaque

- is a sign we put on buildings to share an important message
- says that First Nations people were the first people on Australian land.



7. Include young people

We will

• check if our programs for young people can be better



 make teams of young people who can help other young people join the Church



 invite young people to share ideas at the Plenary Council meeting



 research Church activities that youth will like. For example, a festival.

8. Get our message in schools



We will

 make Catholic school programs in different parts of Australia



 have good leaders in schools to help students be part of the Church



 give information and activities to reach students in public schools



 tell adults why it is important to study the Catholic faith



• ask **seminarians** to work in schools.

Seminarians are men who study to be priests in the Catholic Church.

9. Be kind to everyone



We will

respect people who are **not** part of the Church







- listen to people who do **not** feel included by the Church.
 For example, people
 - who have been divorced
 - who married more than 1 time





- who have been abused
- who are part of the LGBTQI community.


